

4.4 Seekers

¹³By studying esoterics man enters the world of ideas, the world of Platonic ideas, the causal world, the world of real knowledge. It is by working these ideas up into an integrated whole, into a sovereign view on the worlds of man, that the individual acquires the condition of causal intuition.

¹⁴There are two kinds of seekers. The one kind realize the imperfection of the human intellect and the untenability of the ruling ideologies. They try to find the real knowledge of reality, being instinctively certain that such a knowledge must exist – their latent learning makes itself felt. They want to have knowledge in order to liberate themselves from emotional illusions and mental fictions and are content that they have reached clarity. The other category seek for the knowledge in order to serve evolution better, thus do not seek the knowledge for their own sake but for the sake of others. These latter ones are the aspirants to discipleship even though they do not know it themselves.

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
