## The law of freedom says...

- <sup>1</sup> The Law is the sum total of all the laws of nature and of life: the constant relations of matter, motion, and consciousness expressive of the nature of primordial matter and of omnipotent, inexhaustible, eternally dynamic primordial force, acting in its blind way in the imperturbable and inevitable constant relations of nature and life.
- <sup>2</sup> Of this Law, science has not yet explored more than an infinitesimal fraction.
- <sup>3</sup> There are laws in everything and everything is expressive of law. The gods themselves are subject to the Law. Omnipotence is possible only through absolutely faultless application of the laws in their entirety.
